#### 1. Agenda – Welcome and opening statements

The Chair welcomed everyone to the meeting. The agenda was agreed and the previous meeting minutes endorsed.

#### 3. Actions Arising

The WWG has been advised that Defence are proposing some onbase water treatment and has requested that Defence provide further information about the proposed treatment system. DPC advised that Defence had provided an update on this at the CRG and will put the relevant person at Defence in contact with the WWG.

The Panel discussed the uncertainty about the timing of the review of the enHealth guidance announced in June. There was also discussion around whether Europe (EFSA) will be reviewing their health guidelines. NSW Food Authority to follow up with contacts at EFSA.

#### 4a. Updates - Sampling, testing and analysis

OEH provided an update on the mass spectrometer. The LC-MSMS is operational and can begin receiving water samples.

#### 4b. (i) Updates - Water Working Group

The Chair of the Water Working Group provided a summary of its meeting with AECOM to discuss the Draft ESA. The primary comment from the WWG to Defence was that the data included in the draft ESA is from a single point in time. The Panel discussed that caution should be taken in using this data to draw broader conclusions for this reason.

#### 4b. (ii) Updates – Risk Assessment Working Group

The Chair of the Risk Assessment Working Group advised that it will be reviewing the Draft Human Health Risk Assessment once it is provided by Defence.

#### 4c. Updates - Community Reference Group

The Chair of the Community Reference Group provided an update on the most recent CRG meeting. The Panel discussed options for engagement with the community in the coming weeks, particularly around TDIs, enHealth and the HHRA.

#### 4d. Agencies

The Food Authority advised the Panel of the outcomes of testing from a number of imported seafood samples. The Panel noted that the results were low and discussed that the Food Authority should consider providing the results to FSANZ.

Office of the Chief Scientist & Engineer provided an update on a number of studies that have been commissioned.



#### 5. Other Issues

The Panel discussed the timeframes and processes around provision of information back to Defence and the community, with consideration to public release of information and management decision.
