The draft Coastal IFOA appears to have covered every environmental value. The new mapping approaches will hopefully make the usual range of complaints about logging in unapproved areas more difficult to generate and sustain.

## Q18. What parts of the draft Coastal IFOA do you think have a negative outcome on the management of environmental values or the production of sustainable timber? Why?

Despite 10's of pages and 100's of references to environment and conservation, there appears to be no interest in: 1 the economic and financial well-being of the local forestry industry and forest towns; 2 the societal well-being of these forest towns; 3 bush-fire protection in all its forms including fire trails, prescribed burning and forest management. Given the limited Agency consultation program and the dominance of conservation groups, this outcome is not surprising. However, these omissions should be corrected.
